We realize that there is a natural and spiritual application to everything in our lives. Our north country weather has recently reminded us that the season of the natural harvest Is done, the season of rest/repair is upon us. Give Hope During the Holidays

Mention Christmas and we can smell the cookies baking in the oven or hear the laughter of kids playing in the snow. We look forward to the holidays and family gatherings with great anticipation. But for many, the holidays can be a season of deep loneliness and sorrow. Empty chairs and missing laughter are reminders that life has forever changed.

Most of us realize that it is normal for those who have suffered loss to feel great sadness and grief during the holidays. And we know that God can work through us to give the brokenhearted encouragement and companionship. But if you are like many, you may have asked yourself, "How can I give hope to the grieving during the holidays?"

Give the gift of listening. One of the most precious gifts is the simple act of listening. Just being there and listening is so important. Well meaning people at times feel that they must do something or quote scriptures, when really all you need to do is listen. Scripture tells us...

"Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn." Romans 12:15

Give the gift of remembrance. Those who are grieving want to talk about the ones they've lost. Give them space to talk and let that be part of the holiday gathering. Realize that the sounds, smells, and sights of the holidays can trigger some strong emotions. The brokenhearted will likely recall their absent loved one as friends and family gather. Let them know that it's okay to feel pain and that it is an important part of the healing process.

"Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ." Galatians 6:2

Give the gift of comfort. If you have experienced a loss similar to those grieving, ask God to give you the ability to comfort with the comfort you were given.

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ" 2 Corinthians 1:3-5

Give the gift of a new tradition. Encourage the person grieving to consider doing something out of the ordinary during the Christmas season. Volunteer together. Although it can be encouraging for those in mourning to reach out to others, instead of focusing inward, it can also be overwhelming to do this alone. Volunteering in the community for local food banks or visiting shut ins can lift someone's spirits.

Give the gift of friendship. Six months to two years after a loved one's death can be the most difficult time. When friends and relatives stop reaching out and checking in. This is when "life has changed forever" sinks in. Let them know you care and you remember.

Give the gift of prayer. Pray that God will give you His love and wisdom as you minister to the brokenhearted. Take their sorrow to the Lord. Ask Him to heal their hearts, renew their strength, and fill them with the love and comfort of the Holy Spirit.

Give the gift of hope. Remember that the brokenhearted will experience both joy and sadness during the holidays. Yet, despite feelings of incredible loss, God can work through His people to give His comfort. As we share the Christmas story, those grieving will be reminded of our eternal hope. In the midst of the darkness ... the star of Bethlehem shines bright."

Sweeping Up The Hidden Pieces

He uncovers deep things out of darkness, and brings the shadow of death to light. (Job 12:22)

A few years ago, we had broken some glass on the porch. Ken had cleaned it up and was sure he had swept up all of the pieces. A couple of weeks later as I was moving some furniture around on the porch, underneath a small dresser I found a couple of pieces of glass. They were hidden under the dresser. As I looked around, I found a few smaller pieces. If these were stepped on with bare feet it would have hurt. As I swept up the few pieces of glass, some thoughts came to mind.

When we go through life, we can easily become broken and shattered by different situations and problems. Some things we are able to shake off but others we are not. When we come to Jesus, He cleans up much of the shattered pieces that we give to Him. Yet, there are those pieces we don't see that remain hidden or we choose to sweep them under the rug. Sometimes we may find a few pieces in the smallest corners of our heart and only become aware of them from the cut they give us when touched. Other times we may step on the bigger pieces, cutting ourselves and hindering our spiritual walk from the cut. This could be something you had thought you forgave but when a similar situation happens again, you feel the cut and find yourself sifting through hurt emotions. Or you could see someone who had hurt you in the past and though you don't think about the situation any longer, this person triggers certain emotions within you such as anger, rejection, jealousy, fear, etc.

When we come across these hidden pieces of broken glass within us, we must surrender it to the Lord immediately so we don't continue stepping on them and cutting ourselves causing unnecessary pain. There is always the risk of an infection from the cuts which can cause us to become even sicker due to our emotions from it.

He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. (Psalm 147:3)

Have you come across some "hidden" pieces of glass within yourself that you thought were swept up and removed long ago? Don't be discouraged! The work the Lord has within you since then was a mighty work. This new occurrence just means you have found some hidden pieces that need to be swept up and removed.

Get with the Lord today and ask Him to expose any hidden sin or hurt that needs to be removed. If you have stepped on a hidden piece, it is now exposed to you to allow you to surrender it to Him so He can remove it. Sometimes, when it's stepped on just right, those hidden pieces can cause major damage and pain so when they are discovered you must surrender it quickly so the Lord can remove it and save you from more severe damage that could occur.

O Lord my God, I cried to you for help, and you have healed me. (Psalm 30:2)

After noticing the date on the bell, David found two foundries in NY. One was in West Troy, NY (which made the bell). The church bell was made in 1841. After reading the article in his research, David was impressed at the little things we take for granted in the Church. He found that the two foundries made a total of 65,000 church bells in their factories history. The foundry across the Hudson made the bell for the First Baptist Church in Watertown in 1901.
